

The First Lesson: Jonah 3:1-5, 10

The word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time, saying, “Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you.” So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. 

The Vestry is working hard to finalize Immanuel’s operating budget for 2018. This year’s “All Hearts Open” campaign has resulted in a strong response so far, with 157 pledges totaling \$630,957. This includes several commitments from newcomers to our parish family.

Yet there are many people from whom we have yet to hear. We have many, many more people in our parish who have not yet pledged, indeed who perhaps have never pledged. Your parish Church needs you! Without pledge commitments by our parish members, the Vestry cannot plan an operating budget to support our worship, pastoral care, youth and senior, Christian education, evangelism, and fellowship ministries.
