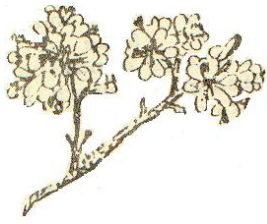

HERE I AM! THE MINISTRY OF PRESENCE CONSIDERED.

One of the favorite quotes of the late Churchill Gibson, long-time chaplain at Virginia Theological Seminary, was that ministry was 95-99% showing up. (He also used to say to us at our most earnest and anxious that if it was Friday at noon and you felt that it was time to climb up on the cross, it was time to go home and take a nap.) In a culture in which so much social interaction is via Facebook, Twitter or a host of other social media, the church is one of those places, like school, where showing up, being physically present, matters. As a community of faith we put a high value on interacting with other people, face-to-face, no Skype involved. As much as I value email and social media for staying in touch with many, many people, family, friends and acquaintances, finally to benefit deeply from a relationship I need to spend time with the people who are in my life. There's another party to this relationship in our lives as a congregation, and that party is Christ. While I believe that God in Christ is everywhere and with us always, the well where I go to eat and drink of this presence is a church full of God's people.

In the nearly four months that I have been at ICOH you have been faithful and honest about what you are seeking from God and from the relationship with one another that defines what it means to be this congregation. In response, throughout the summer, the Worship, Mission and Outreach, Growth and Education Committees have met and planned a fall, winter and spring full of opportunities to engage in our relationship with Christ and one another in many ways that we hope will deepen our lives as a congregation as well inspire us to bring Christ's reconciling love to the world. Opportunities for all ages abound to worship, learn, play and serve. Now we need you to be present.

We can offer outstanding opportunities for our youth through Godly Play, Sunday school, confirmation, acolytes, youth group, choir and community service, but if we don't have a critical mass of young people participating offering these ministries becomes very challenging both for the adults who give of their time and their lives, as well as the young people who do participate and wonder where everyone else is. Likewise we have expanded our worship and formation opportunities for adults as requested, but there too we need folks to say "Here I am". Pumpkin season will be upon us and one of the largest efforts in the metropolitan area to serve the neediest in the world will require a little bit of time from as many of us as are able to make this event a reality. We need you to be present.

A great deal competes for our time. Most of which is very good and fun. For congregational life to be holy and formative, we need to choose it, and the God of love, justice and mercy who makes it possible at least as often, if not more, than everything else in our lives competing for our time. This is how we are formed and made disciples of Christ. All these years later there is great wisdom in the adage that a great deal of ministry is just showing up. My prayer for us is just that.

October is Coming — and so are Pumpkins

Pumpkins will arrive at 11:30-am, Sunday the 7th of October 2012. We will be celebrating Mass-on-the-Grass that morning at 10 a.m. with the Very Rev. Ian Markham, Dean of VTS as our guest preacher. Pumpkin unloading will begin immediately after the service, so wear pumpkin appropriate attire – suitable for unloading. This year we will again have two trucks the first day. The next two trucks will arrive at 4-pm, Wednesday the 17th of October. This is our largest fundraiser for **OUTREACH** and this is our **Nineteenth** year for this wonderful project. So how can you help now?

First If you are new to Immanuel since last October, or you just want more information about our Pumpkin Patch, please talk to John von Senden, Jim Snow or anyone on the Outreach Committee.

Second Please start **COOKING** and **FREEZING** you own preferred recipe of **SOUPS** and **BREADS** and list the ingredients. A substantial portion of our profit comes from food sales.

We have standard quart containers for soups; we've learned this size and container works best for both cooks and customers. Breads can be packaged as you choose. The containers are located in the Narthex. If you run out of freezer space at home we have a freezer at church; please coordinate with Mary Taylor before using the church freezer though.

Remember that pretty packaging (such as a ribbon or sticker) really helps our sales of these items. And please don't forget the **LIST OF INGREDIENTS** (which helps avoid food allergy issues).

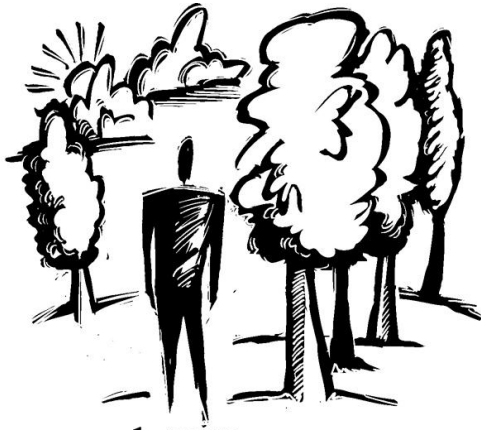

Holy Cross Abbey

November 30 - December 2

Advent for Jesus was leaving his Nazareth and heading to John, the Jordan River, and wilderness. The choice to remain within the security and safety of our own ðNazarethö or journey determines whether we meet our ðJohnö and are led to waters of new life. Our retreat time together will be devoted to exploring how this ancient biblical story is our story as well. In small groups and alone we will explore Jesus' stories as well as be stretched and challenged by contemporary poetry, art, movement, film, journaling, and silence. We will sum up our journey together by breaking bread and drinking wine.

For the sixth year, the Immanuel Advent retreat will be at Holy Cross Abbey in the foothills of the Shenandoah Mountains by the Shenandoah River on a 1200 acre farm near Berryville, Virginia. Our retreat leader will be the Rev. Dr. William Dols, Immanuel Church-on-the-Hill's rector from 1972-1983

The retreat center also has a bookstore (a peaceful place for Christmas shopping) specializing in Cistercian/Benedictine literature, CDs, monastery fruitcakes, honeys and chocolates. The retreat will begin on Friday afternoon, November 30, shortly before the evening meal and will end after the noon meal on Sunday, December 2. The \$300.00 registration fee includes all materials, comfortable accommodations, individual rooms with a private bathroom, and all meals.

Two scholarships given in memory of Charles Willis are available; please contact the rector for scholarship assistance.

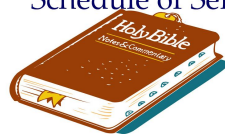
