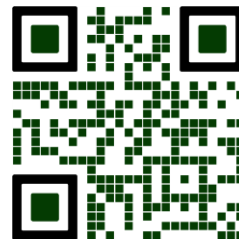

LOOKING AHEAD TO ADVENT AT IMMANUEL “Advent prayer as waiting and longing”

There will be three opportunities for quiet devotion on Tuesday evenings in Advent: December 3, 10, and 17 from 5:15-6:00 p.m. in the Oratory Chapel at the Seminary, with the **Rev. Dr. Sarah Coakley**.

These sessions will be a continuation of the quiet prayer group that formed last Lent, but newcomers are particularly welcomed, and a few minutes of simple advice about the practice of silence will be given at the start. The third session will consist of a short corporate silence followed by a simple, contemplative eucharist. If you would like to deepen your prayer, with the support of others, during this very busy time of year, do come along and be surprised by the profundity of this shared act of attention and adoration.

Dr. Coakley will also give a **Forum Hour on Sunday Dec 8** (at 11:45 a.m. in the VTS Welcome Center next to Immanuel Chapel) with a connected presentation and open discussion on: *“Re-thinking Advent as a Spiritual Project: Repentance, Longing and Hope.”*

CHRISTMAS FAMILIES 2024 – Signing Up for a Family

And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.' (Matthew 25:40)

Today is the first Sunday you can sign up to buy gifts for a family, or part of one, to bring the good news of Christ's coming and God's love in a very tangible form – a toy to grow with, clothing to keep warm in and that children are proud to wear, increasing their self-esteem – to another family, transforming a bleak Christmas into the light of Christ present. **Sign-up is before or after each service on Sundays Nov. 24, Dec. 1, and Dec. 8**, or in the Zabriskie Narthex during the week. You can also email or call Linda Serabian (see below) with a description of the kind of family you would like (number, age, and gender of children) and she will select a family for you and send you the information. We have so far **72 families**, 181 children and 89 parents, 270 people in all, with more to come.

Ingathering of the gifts and blessing at the altar will be on Dec. 15, which is also the Sunday of the special collection. Or you can bring the gifts to the parish office before Dec. 15. Dec. 15 is also the Sunday of the great forum hour party to wrap gifts for children and parents not "adopted".

In addition, **used computers** will find eager fingers and minds. Also very welcome are **used bicycles in any shape, good used toys and children's books, calendars you receive in the mail, and gently used clothing and blankets** (for children and adults), especially warm winter coats and clothes to wear to a new-found job. (Please label packages of clothing as to kind and size.). They will be arranged in "Boutique" at Social and Human Services for social workers to pick up for client families.

For the **bicycle program** we partner with Vélocity Bicycle Cooperative (<https://velocitycoop.org/donate-stuff/>), 2111 Mt Vernon Avenue, Tuesday. – Sat. 10 am – 4 pm. They provide beautifully refurbished bikes for many children on our list. You can take used bicycles directly to them or bring them to the church. It would be great if some Immanuelites, including young people, would volunteer for Vélocity. They will teach you bicycle repair.

Connie Kurz and Laura Snow buy children's books in quantity at very good prices, and then, with a team, assign books for each of the families, to be wrapped and united with the other gifts for the family.

Posting to your neighborhood listserv may move some people not members of Immanuel to sign up for a family on our list. We want to expand the **social media effort to get people in surrounding neighborhoods involved**. If you can help, let Linda Serabian know.

A vignette. In a previous year we received a last-minute referral of a family who was evicted and all of their stuff was moved out, but they were allowed to stay for a few more days to celebrate Christmas in the empty apartment. Another group got them a tree and decorations, and we got them nice toys and a generous gift card. The little girls didn't seem to notice they had no furniture. One of the little girls wants to become a veterinarian, so we got her an 18" doll with a collection of doll clothes, including a veterinarian outfit, expertly produced by the XFAM sewing group Candy Levin, Laura Snow, and Brooke Roberts.

Christmas Families is a small yet so big part of transforming the world and comforting God's people. We make the world new by putting a toy into a child's hands to help her grasp the world in her mind, or by giving a stuffed tiger as a huggable companion and clothes to keep warm. There are billions of children in the world, so you might ask "What does it matter?" It matters very much to the children and parents in the family for whom you sign up to provide gifts.

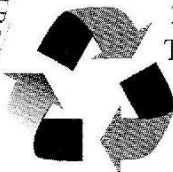
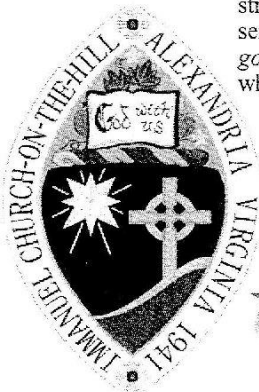

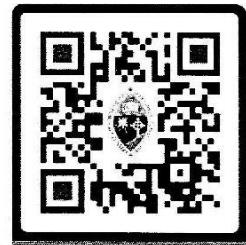
