The Collect for the Day

O God, the protector of all who trust in you, without whom nothing is strong, nothing is holy: Increase and multiply upon us your mercy; that, with you as our ruler and guide, we may so pass through things temporal, that we lose not the things eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

The First Lesson: 1 Kings 3:5-12

At Gibeon the Lord appeared to Solomon in a dream by night; and God said, "Ask what I should give you." And Solomon said, "You have shown great and steadfast love to your servant my father David, because he walked before you in faithfulness, in righteousness, and in uprightness of heart toward you; and you have kept for him this great and steadfast love, and have given him a son to sit on his throne today. And now, O Lord my God, you have made your servant king in place of my father David, although I am only a little child; I do not know how to go out or come in. And your servant is in the midst of the people whom you have chosen, a great people, so numerous they cannot be numbered or counted. Give your servant therefore an understanding mind to govern your people, able to discern between good and evil; for who can govern this your great people?"

It pleased the Lord that Solomon had asked this. God said to him, "Because you have asked this, and have not asked for yourself long life or riches, or for the life of your enemies, but have asked

The Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose. For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn within a large family. And those whom he predestined he also called; and those whom he called he also justified; and those whom he justified he also glorified.

What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered."

No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to Matthew Response: *Glory to you, Lord Christ*.

Jesus put before the crowds another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in his field; it is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches."





At Zabriskie, the AED is located along the small stairwell going from the chapel (near the organ) up to the parish hall. The first aid kit is in the kitchen.

LET US CELEBRATE! A YEAR OF SOLAR POWER AT IMMANUEL CHURCH-ON-THE-HILL The Gift that Keeps on Giving!

On June 7, 2023, Immanuel Church-on-the-Hill passed our 1-Year Solar Anniversary, a year of public commitment to Creation Care and reducing our carbon emissions—letting our neighbors know we are true and faithful stewards of "this fragile earth, our island home" (Eucharistic Prayer C – The Great Thanksgiving- The Book of Common Prayer).

Many thanks to Doug John for leading the funding drive and to all who contributed to the purchase and installation of the solar panels. Many thanks also to our 2021 Vestry who, with the support and encouragement of Father Randy and Immanuel's Buildings, Grounds and Creation Care group, voted to move forward with the project. There were many different reasons to vote "Yes" and to contribute that year. Some were motivated by the need to take an active and public step to reduce carbon emissions that have already drastically changed earth's climate and accelerated dangerous weather events; others saw a chance to save money on electricity bills and to shield the church from unexpected and unwelcome electricity rate hikes. But no matter the reason, that Yes vote and the contributions of so many parishioners resulted in a gift of the solar panels to Immanuel Church-on-the-Hill. The bullets below highlight the key findings for Immanuel's first complete year of solar generation.

Our solar panels

- ✓ Generated 64,750 kWh of clean sustainable electricity, coming in at 99.6% of the estimated generation figure our installer, SES, gave us for the first year of operation!
- ✓ Prevented sending over 100,000 pounds of carbon dioxide emissions into God's atmosphere, equivalent to
- ✓ Planting 760 new trees or
- ✓ Supplying a year of carbon-emissions-free electricity for six houses (per U.S. Energy Information Administration, average annual electricity consumption for an American household in 2021 was 10,632 kWh)
- ✓ Generated 73% of the electricity Zabriskie Chapel-Parish Hall's needed for the year!

Cost Savings: Because our panels generated 73 percent of the electricity the building needed, Immanuel only spent \$4,118.33 – a savings of \$5,596.29 over what we spent on electricity in 2021 (\$9,714.62) and where building kWh consumption was similar for both years. Note: That savings would be even greater had not Virginia's average electricity rates increased 20% between December 2021 and December 2022, per U.S. Energy Information Agency, (mostly due to 2022 price spikes in methane gas and coal).

Bonus – SREC Payments: In addition to electricity bill savings, by going solar, Immanuel receives approximately \$3,150/year from the Virginia Solar Renewable Energy Credit (SREC) program. We have

already received \$2,091.00 for the solar electricity generated by our panels during the first nine months and expect an additional \$1,100 for March/April/May '23 generation. When SREC earnings are applied to electricity bill.

To help illustrate annual cost savings, the chart below shows Zabriskie Parish Hall's electricity use in kWh and Cost for 2021 and some previous years. Note that kWh consumption in 2019 is roughly similar to prior years. kWh consumption plummeted in 2020 after the March 2020 Pandemic shut-down. The building's kWh consumption increased in 2021 and has remained roughly similar in 2022 and 2023, but still significantly under pre-Pandemic levels, probably due to less building use (fewer services and events in Zabriskie than in 2019 and

prior years).
