The Collect for the Day

Give us grace, O Lord, to answer readily the call of our Savior Jesus Christ and proclaim to all people the Good News of his salvation, that we and the whole world may perceive the glory of his marvelous works; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

UPCOMING YOUTH CONFIRMATION CLASS FOR THOSE IN 7TH-12TH GRADES

Immanuel is scheduled for a **bishop's visitation and confirmation on Sunday, April 28**th. We are now forming a class for those youth who are interested in being confirmed. The Outline of Faith (the Catechism) that can be found in The Book of Common Prayer explains confirmation as "the rite in which we express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop. It is required of those to be confirmed that they have been baptized, are sufficiently instructed in the Christian Faith, are penitent for their sins, and are ready to affirm their confession of Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord." (BCP pg. 860)

During our confirmation course, our youth will explore the Bible, the Book of Common Prayer, the Sacraments, Spiritual Practices, Church History, and practice sharing stories from their own faith journeys. Each class will begin with community building, and have interactive lessons to explore the topics mentioned above. We will end with a meal shared with our Episcopal Youth Community. The EYC will then meet until 7PM in the Parish Hall. Our first class will be February 4th at 4PM in Rev. Sarah's office. We will generally meet on the first and third Sundays of each month.

Separately, we will also invite any adults who wish to be confirmed or received into the Church to gather for their own preparation.
