**SAINTS SUSTAIN US...** Join us weekdays for Morning Prayer, and you'd chuckle over all the books staff and clergy bring to the table. 'Going with the Spirit' for who leads prayers or reads scripture, we'll each have our personal tools of the faith: the 1979 Book of Common Prayer, The Holy Bible, Forward Day By Day, and the parish directory. Intercessions now include praying for Immanuel families by name, using the directory.

The Book of Common Prayer recognizes saints such as the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Apostles, Evangelists, Mary Magdalene and the first martyr of the church, Stephen. Yet, the Episcopal Church also imagined a supplement highlighting Days of Optional Observances to remember heroes of the faith. So we also have Holy Women, Holy Men: Celebrating the Saints, the new replacement authorized by the 2009 General Convention for books formerly known as Lesser Feasts and Fasts.

Holy Women, Holy Men is the first major revision of the Episcopal Church's liturgical calendar in more than 40 years! All commemorations in Lesser Feasts and Fasts were retained, with many new ones added. Three scripture readings (instead of current two) are provided for all minor holy days. There is additional new material including a votive mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary, many more ecumenical commemorations of lay and ordained individuals, plus a proper for space exploration.

One intention of *Holy Women, Holy Men* is to show us examples of heroic faith and devotion. For a long while, I strongly resonated with the fisherman Peter when he was called to become a disciple of Jesus. Leaving Visa USA after 26.5 years, that was me 'dropping my net' to follow Christ. I followed, not knowing where or to what it would take me. I knew God was calling me into something new, but never imagined that ministry of a different kind, shape, and way lay ahead for me.

Like Peter, I struggle with my humanity while exploring what it means to be pastoral to others. I am not perfect, and like Peter, I fail often. But I've learned to trust more in God's infinite power and mercy. Like Peter, I am a simple man who desires to follow Christ's example. Like Peter, I was thrust into positions of leadership which sometimes surprised me or invoked panic within me. Like Peter, I often said the first thing that came to mind (which is not always helpful when you're really trying to be pastoral).

Attending a seminar from the Episcopal Church Foundation, the opening guided meditation on Barnabas, "Son of Encouragement," struck a chord deep within me. Offering support, confidence, or hope to someone else; Providing assistance and advice to others so they are moved to action; Helping stimulating activities, states, or views to develop; To encourage, embolden, hearten, to foster, and even to instigate (in a positive manner). I was caught by surprise. Later, my field Ed supervisor shared that his experience of me was less like Peter, and more like Barnabas. He handed me copied pages for St. Barnabas the Apostle (HWHM 420-21, Feast Day: June 11) while he noted many instances where I had encouraged him.

So maybe I'm less like Peter and more like Barnabas. I wonder which saint might be an example for you.
