A Church that Asks Nothing

Dear Friends,

Imagine the following: a Church with no staff, no outreach to those in need, no education or formation for children, youth, or adults, no pastoral care of its people, and no buildings or property to maintain. Nothing much is asked of its members, except for showing up occasionally.

If I found myself leading such a Church (and I would be hard-pressed to call it a Church!), I would still have to say that, as Christians, we would all need to give. We would need to remember that we are surrounded by God's incredible and lavish blessings, the gift and mystery of life itself being the supreme example.

Immanuel is not like the fictional Church I mention above—far from it, thank God!! I believe God is, and has long been, up to something powerful in the amazing group of folk who meet for worship at the corner of Seminary Road and Quaker Lane. We are a rich tapestry, and the community in which we live needs the strong witness of this historic and beloved Church. For God's mission to be advanced further we all must give; prayerfully, deliberately, and yes, joyfully.

Christian Stewardship begins with the basic recognition of our dependence of God, not with budgets or pledge campaigns or telemarketing or pressure tactics. It begins in the individual heart of the believer, choosing prayerfully and deliberately to give, out of thanksgiving for what God has already given us. This giving comes from all that we have and all that we ever hope to be, and it includes our time, our talents, and our treasure. It is a radically different posture towards money and materials things than our culture teaches us. Sometimes it even seems to go against human nature!

The second part of giving, of course, is deciding prayerfully and deliberately where the money or the time or the talents will be directed. Many opportunities present themselves for the Christian. Indeed, there are many charities that advance God's aims in the world through their work. However, there is only one institution, the Church, which has the central mandate of proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ and working towards the restoration of relationship of all people with God and with one another. Our Lord said, "Seek first the Kingdom of God, and all these other things will be added unto you, as well" (Matthew 6:33).

The annual pledge drive is a wonderful opportunity to take inventory of what we have been given, and in what ways we are called to give back. I have no reservation whatsoever in asking you to give prayerfully, deliberately, and joyfully towards the health and growth of our parish. A helpful, annual, *spiritual* exercise is to add up all of one's income, then all that one gives away, and then figure the resulting percentage. A further exercise is to find the percentage of giving to the Church out of the overall giving. If that percentage is not what you think it should be, or not the amount towards which you think God is calling you, a time-honored approach towards growth in Stewardship is to raise that percentage each year. **Commitment Sunday will be November 10**th.

Praise God from whom all blessings flow!

Stewardship Forum Hour -- Imagining Our Future

Immanuel parishioners gathered for an adult forum hour, sponsored by the Stewardship Committee and facilitated by Rev. Jan Maas, to "imagine our future." After an opening prayer led by Rev. Randy Alexander, the discussion began with a brief overview of how the parish invests its operating budget and pumpkin patch profits by percentage across six broad mission areas: Worship (19%), Pastoral Care (7%), Fellowship (9%), Outreach (26%), Growth & Education (10%) and Our Home (29%). Parishioners were asked to consider where Immanuel might grow or enhance investments across these broad mission areas, and a lively discussion followed.

Two major themes emerged. The first was a perceived need to increase the visibility of Immanuel Church-on-the-Hill in our community to attract new parishioners. Participants suggested increased communication through local newspapers and newsletters, social media, neighborhood links and email notices, the ICOH website, and development of an ICOH app as ways to advertise and connect others to our fellowship, worship and outreach activities. The second theme was the need to invest more resources in our youth. Many participants viewed this as being fundamental to sustaining and growing our parish. Suggestions for building Immanuel's youth programs included hiring a parish youth minister; planning and institutionalizing activities that bring children and adults together, and minimizing activities that draw parents away from family; empowering our youth with a bigger role in worship; and making connections to local elementary, middle and high school age youth within and outside Immanuel. Linked to these two themes, parishioners voiced the need for greater diversity in planning and implementing parish activities by attracting volunteer resources from all age groups in Immanuel, and maintaining strong links to ECUSA, the Diocese and the Seminary.

The Forum Hour discussion will aid the Vestry as it begins developing Immanuel's 2014 operating budget, but making these dreams a reality is up to each of us. Please consider prayerfully your 2014 commitment to our Immanuel family and help us to realize our dream of a vibrant, multi-generational church now and in the future.

AN EVENT TO BENEFIT CHRISTIANS IN

PESAWAR, PAKISTAN: All are invited to join the Virginia Theological Seminary on Tuesday, October 29, 2013 at 7:30 p.m. at an event to benefit Christians in Peshawar, Pakistan. This event has been prompted by the recent attack on Christians there. On September 22, suicide bombers struck All Saints Church, Peshawar, as worshippers were leaving. More than one-hundred persons died, and nearly two-hundred were injured. Many of those who died were the principal source of income for their families. Amid their grief, whole families, and the Christian community generally, face uncertain futures. Already threatened by extremism, they confront economic and social loss as well. Christians in Pakistan are a tiny minority of this Muslim-majority nation. Relations between Christians and Muslims have usually been good. But Pakistan, and Peshawar in particular, are the front lines of the war on terror. The violence of a few wreaks great damage.

The featured speaker on Oct. 29 will be the Rev. Dr. Titus Presler, president of Edwardes College, a church-related institution in Peshawar. Dr. Presler will make a presentation on the current situation in Peshawar and be available for questions and further discussion.

A \$20 donation will be requested and further opportunity for donations will be made available at the event. Dessert, coffee and tea will be served. Please note space is limited and those wishing to attend must contact the Center for Anglican Communion Studies at cacs@vts.edu.

All donations will go to directly to the families impacted. Let us take our strength, our faith and our partnership with VTS and reach around the world to help rebuild the lives of these families.

UPDATE ON THE FUTURE OF SHRINE MONT CAMPS: Many Immanuel parishioners attended the June 23 forum hour when Churchill J. "Kirk" Gibson, Director of Development at Shrine Mont, led a lively discussion about how Shrine Mont and the Diocese are helping to strengthen and grow the Church through their youth camp programs. He invited the parish to submit opinions about the future of the camps through an online survey.

This week, The Rt. Rev. Shannon S. Johnston reported that 98 percent of survey participants in the Diocese of Virginia supported a campaign to ensure the future of the camps. To that end, Bishop Johnston announced a capital campaign designed to raise funds that will pay for repairs and improvements to Shrine Mont's camps and other facilities, establish an endowment for continuing maintenance, add to the camp scholarship program, and raise the stipends for camp counselors to competitive levels. The goal for the capital campaign is \$2 million.
