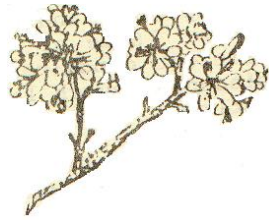

CHRISTMAS FAMILIES IN AUGUST: AFGHANISTAN, DOMINICAN REPUBLIC, HAITI, ALEXANDRIA

Help children with school supplies – critical tools for learning!

The mind needs tools, tools to take notes, organize notes to comprehend the world, tools for writing and expression in art. In a word, children need school supplies for learning and a backpack to carry them in. Every fall in the past years we have helped children in the Dominican Republic, Haiti, and Alexandria so they do not go off to school without the critical tools for learning. We provided backpacks, notebooks, crayons, pencils, scissors, calculators, or the money for gym uniforms and fees. This is so important not only by giving children the supplies they need but also by raising their spirit and joy of learning.

This year we add orphanages in Afghanistan to this ministry, responding to a plea from parishioner Keith June, who is stationed there. We will send supplies – plain and colored pencils, crayons, markers, composition books.

Status report

The Alexandria Community and Human Services department sent us a list of 45 families with 90 school-age children. Parishioners signed up to provide school supplies for all but four of these families (including two large ones). We use the supply lists for each grade as posted by each school.

Parishioners have also bought supplies for Afghanistan. The first special collection on July 20 raised \$ 450.

How you can help between now and August 17.

You can still sign up for one of the remaining families, perhaps partnering with others for one of the large families. You can bring supplies for Afghanistan (collection box in the Narthex). Last, and most critical, **you can donate money** between now and the second special collection on August 17. Please make checks out to Immanuel Church-on-the-Hill and mark them XFAM. We hope to exceed last year's total of \$6,000 so we can send to each of the receiving organizations an amount that will make a difference. The money will be allocated approximately as follows:

First we will determine how much is needed to round out the school supplies to be sent to Afghanistan and for postage. Then:

One third to Episcopal schools in the Dominican Republic

One third to Episcopal schools in Haiti

One third to Alexandria (1/6 to Child Protective Services and 1/6 to Community Lodgings)

Let us give all children a good start in the new school year!

AID FOR AFGHAN CHILDREN: As part of Christmas Families in August, we have been asked to donate school supplies to help orphans in Afghanistan. Immanuel parishioner Colonel Keith June is stationed in Afghanistan. Keith emails us about the need: "One of the things done here is providing items for orphanages in Afghanistan. This is initiative of the church and not formally tied to the [military] mission. ... One of the things that breaks my heart is the plight of Afghan children. While we can't change the nation of Afghanistan, I think we can make a small difference in the lives of the children who ultimately will decide the future of this troubled land."

Keith asks us to send school supplies. What's needed are composition books, crayons in snack bags, colored pencils, wooden pencils. We will repack many of the items in gallon size plastic bags to reduce the weight and associated shipping costs. A collection box will be placed in the narthex for your donation.

We are asked not to send cash. However, if you want to make a cash contribution as part of Christmas in August, part of that money will be used to help Afghan orphans. We will also be providing school supplies for kids in Haiti and the Dominican Republic. Make your check out to ICOH and designate "Christmas in August" on the memo line.

PARISHONER PROFILE: In the 1970's, **Betty Wanamaker** was looking for a Sunday School for her children. Emmett Hoy, then Head of St. Stephen's School,

recommended Immanuel Church on the Hill, where Coleman McGhee was rector. It was the start of her long relationship with Immanuel. As time progressed, Betty became very involved with issues central to the parish, diocese and the national church. Among these were the ordination of women and the revision of the 1928 Book of Common Prayer. Both matters figured prominently at the General Convention which Betty attended in 1976. Resolutions for adoption of a new BCP and the ordination of women both passed at that General Convention.

Betty met the Reverend Bill Dols while they were working on a mid-Atlantic parish training program. Bill asked her to interview for a position at Immanuel as a Lay Minister and Assistant to the Rector. She began work at Immanuel in 1977 and soon began a two-year certificate program from the Parish Counseling and Consultation Center of Greater Washington. Pastoral matters were a significant emphasis of her ministry at Immanuel until her retirement in 1995. Becoming aware of the strong interest in spirituality at Immanuel Betty received a diploma in spiritual direction from the Benedictine Monastery in Pecos, NM

For 17 years, Betty was adjunct faculty at VTS. She supervised seminarians in their field work and advised them as a colloquy mentor. A colloquy is a caucus in which middlers, second-year students, meet with their mentors to discuss recent experiences in parish field work. One student whom she supervised was Martha Horne, later dean of VTS. Betty has also served on VTS ad-hoc issue-oriented groups. In 1996, VTS awarded Betty a Doctorate of Humane Letters for her ministries at Immanuel and VTS and in the Diocese of Virginia and larger Church. She is still connected to the seminary in various ways and continues to provide spiritual direction which some of her former seminarians. She maintains a strong interest in national church and diocesan matters and she has served as a member of the Commission on Ministry, the Standing Committee and as a Deputy to General Convention.

Immanuel was, and is, for her and so many others, a faith community of hope and inspiration, challenge and renewal, a place for prayerful reflection and committed service, a place to continue our journeys in the spirit with fellow travelers. It becomes a way of life.



Advent Retreat

Listening to the Advent Collects Advent Retreat 2014

Holy Cross Abbey

December 12-14

The collects (collectives or community prayers) of the Prayer Book are designed to teach the church as well as petition the Lord. During our time together we will learn to listen to what the collects are saying to us and focus with special intent on the four Advent Collects. The dozens of collects throughout the Prayer Book will be ours for reflection and meditation. Our retreat leader will be the Rev. Frank Wade, an Immanuel parishioner and an experienced retreat leader, author and teacher.

The Immanuel Advent retreat will be at Holy Cross Abbey in the foothills of the Shenandoah Mountains by the Shenandoah River on a 1200 acre farm near Berryville, Virginia. The Cistercian monks of Holy Cross Abbey have been praying on the Berryville property since 1950; retreat participants will benefit from this location steeped in prayer as they explore the retreat theme. Cistercians observe silence at all times to aid reflection, prayer, and listening to God. During the Advent Retreat, silence will be observed except in the program sessions. 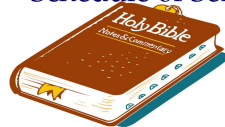
