The First Lesson: Jeremiah 23:1-6

The Holy Gospel: Luke 23:33-43

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to Luke
People: *Glory be to thee, O Lord.*

When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." And they cast lots to divide his clothing. The people stood by, watching Jesus on the cross; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, "He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!" The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!" There was also an inscription over him, "This is the King of the Jews."

One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

CHRISTMAS FAMILIES 2025 -- *Sign-up for a family today!*

From Matthew 25:40: *And the king will answer them,
'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.'*

This is the first Sunday you can sign up to buy gifts for a family, or part of one, to bring the good news of Christ's coming and God's love in a very tangible form – a toy to grow with, an art kit for creativity, clothing to keep warm in and that youth are proud to wear, increasing their self-esteem, costume jewelry – to another family, transforming a bleak Christmas into the light of Christ present. As you sign up, we will give you a sheet with information on the children's interests and suggestions on the type of gifts that have lasting value. Sign-up before or after each Sunday service today, November 30th and December 7th; or stop by the Zabriskie Narthex on weekdays. You can also contact Linda Serabian serabian@somaarchitects.com with a description of the kind of family you would like (number, age, and gender of children), and she will select a family for you and send you the information.

Currently we have **83 families, 197 children** and 91 parents, 288 people in all. We are one of the few places that does not turn away families even at the last minute, so we may have more to come.

Ingathering of the gifts and blessing on the altar will be held Gaudete Sunday, December 14th, which is also the Sunday of the special collection. Or you can bring the gifts to the parish office before that day. December 14th is also the Sunday of the great forum hour party to wrap gifts for children and parents not "adopted".

Please bring **paper wall calendars you receive in the mail.** We will add them to the gift bags. For the **bicycle program** we partner with Vélocity Bicycle Cooperative (<https://velocitycoop.org/donate-stuff/>), 2111 Mt Vernon Avenue. They provide beautifully refurbished bikes for many children on our list. You can take used bicycles directly to them or bring them to the church. It would be great if some Immanuelites, including young people, would volunteer for Vélocity. They will teach you bicycle repair.

Connie Kurz and Laura Snow buy children's books in quantity at very good prices, and then, with a team, assign books for each of the families, to be wrapped and united with the other gifts for the family. Posting to your neighborhood listserv may move some people not members of Immanuel to sign-up for a family on our list. We want to expand the **social media effort to get people in surrounding neighborhoods involved.** If you can help, let Linda Serabian know.

A vignette. In a previous year we received a last-minute referral of a family who was evicted and lost all of their possessions, but they were allowed to stay for a few more days to celebrate Christmas in the empty apartment. Another group got them a tree and decorations, and we got them nice toys and a generous gift card. The little girls didn't seem to notice they had no furniture. One of the little girls wants to become a veterinarian, so we got her an 18" doll with a collection of doll clothes, including a veterinarian outfit, expertly produced by the XFAM sewing group Candy Levin, Laura Snow, and Brooke Roberts.

Christmas Families is a small yet so big part of transforming the world and comforting God's people. We make the world new by putting a toy into a child's hands to help her grasp the world in her mind, or by giving a stuffed tiger as a huggable companion and clothes to keep warm.

There are billions of children in the world, so you might ask "What does it matter?". It matters very much to the children and parents in the family for whom you sign up to provide gifts.
