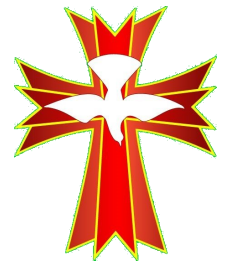

The First Lesson: Genesis 11:1-9

Now the whole earth had one language and the same words. And as they migrated from the east, they came upon a plain in the land of Shinar and settled there. And they said to one another, "Come, let us make bricks, and burn them thoroughly." And they had brick for stone, and bitumen for mortar. Then they said, "Come, let us build ourselves a city, and a tower with its top in the heavens, and let us make a name for ourselves; otherwise we shall be scattered abroad upon the face of the whole earth." The New Testament: Acts 2:1-21 *In observance of Pentecost, parishioners will read in many languages.*

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs-- in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine."

But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

''In the last days it will be, God declares,
that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh,
and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy,
and your young men shall see visions,
and your old men shall dream dreams.
Even upon my slaves, both men and women,
in those days I will pour out my Spirit;
and they shall prophesy.
And I will show portents in the heaven above
and signs on the earth below,
blood, and fire, and smoky mist.
The sun shall be turned to darkness
and the moon to blood,
before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day.
Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.' "

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to John

I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If in my name you ask me for anything, I will do it.

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you."

"I have said these things to you while I am still with you. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid."

JUNE Food Drive for ALIVE!

Traditionally, Immanuel dutifully collected canned goods and non- perishable foods for ALIVE! for two months each year. **The need remains great, and the list of categories has grown as a result.** Our last collection in January was a great success bringing in over 500 pounds of food . CHRISTMAS FAMILIES IN AUGUST CAMPAIGN FOR LEARNING 2025

Haiti and Alexandria (*financially-challenged and refugee families*)

First sign-up and special collection today, ingathering and special collection Sunday August 10.

Help children with school supplies - critical tools for learning!

It is hard to learn to write if you don't have a pencil. Christmas Families in August is about making sure that many more children have pencils so they can learn and develop to their full potential — a small step to moving education towards contributing to a more equal and just society. We get referrals from the Department of Community and Human Services (DCHS) and the Refugee Ministry administered by Christ Church for the Alexandria Episcopal churches. We are expecting 100 families with 200 children who need help.

There are two ways you can help:

(1) Sign up to provide a backpack filled with school supplies for the children in one family, starting today and ending Sunday, August 3 We will give you all the information you need.

(2) Donate money through the special collections held today and Sunday, August 10. The money will go to the Haiti [Micah project](#). For the 150 children it serves, education offers the only path out of extreme poverty. In Haiti, there is no free public education. This funding adds to the Easter Appeal specifically for school supplies (50%, last year \$2,000), [Community Lodgings](#) (25%, last year \$1,000)

Buying school supplies for families not signed-up for (last year \$1,200).
