Thank you for signing up to help make another family's Christmas happy.

- ▼ To keep children warm and foster their intellectual and emotional development, please give a **new toy or art set or ball or whatever**. If possible, **include some item of warm clothing**; new underwear and socks are a special need, other clothing is welcome (can be used, not wrapped).
- **▼** Large used items are good gifts (e.g., bicycle, iPod). Other used toys (not wrapped) are welcome.
- ♥ Please include a **double set of batteries** where needed.
- ♥ Please include a **small gift for the mother and/or father** and any other adults.
- ♥ What to get. Generally one nice gift per child. The gift suggestions indicate a child's area of interest or need; you need not feel bound by them (especially if very expensive). Consider toys with lasting play value that help the child develop, such as a Fisher-Price playset, a truck, doll, stuffed animal, or art kit, a building set; Lego or Duplo can meet a wish for a car, truck, or pull toy, included in or buildable from Lego/Duplo, and offers more opportunity for creative play. Duplo for ages 1-5, Lego 4-12 (Lego Technic 9-12); avoid Lego for households with children under 3. An educational toy or an art kit may be better than a gift card.
- ♥ Wrap each gift and put a gift tag with only the child's name on each package. Put all gifts in a nice-looking bag/box; affix this sheet or a big label with the number of the family on it.
- ▶ Note. **Books**. Connie Kurz, Laura Snow, and team will select books for the children in all families on our list. The books will be added to the bag(s) of gifts for each family on Dec. 11.
