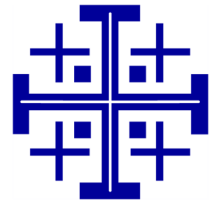

Join with fellow Immanuelites in Richmond for the Virginia Interfaith Center "*Day for All People*" January 15, 2025

The Day for All People is the annual "lobby day" for the Interfaith Center, and Immanuel has long sent a sizable group to meet with our state representatives to learn about the legislative process and support legislation that advances issues of concern to a wide range of faith communities. We will once again rent a motor coach that we will share with folks coming from other Alexandria congregations. The Virginia Interfaith Center will be focusing its interaction with the General Assembly in part on two issues that the Vestry recently adopted as Immanuel policy:

- (1) legislation to make it easier for churches to build affordable housing on their property (a.k.a., "Yes in God's Back Yard"); this has been difficult for churches (such as nearby Resurrection) because of zoning restrictions (Immanuel has no such plans!); and
- (2) expanding prisoners' access to higher education, a priority of our Governor.

You can register on the Interfaith Center's website (go to www.virginiainterfaithcenter.org and scroll down). The Social Justice Committee can reimburse you if you'd like.

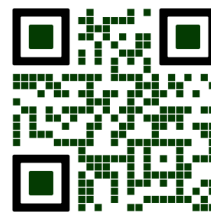


UPDATE: Every Member Pledge Campaign for 2025 “Living Gratefully”

Keep in mind that we are still expecting referrals — some from the Lazarus Ministry (Episcopal Region IV) — especially at the last minute. So we hope for many more sign-ups today. Large families are divided; you can sign up for part or team up with another parishioner for a whole family. **The special collection is used to buy nice lasting gifts for the remaining children and books for all.** This requires a lot of money, so please be generous.

The books will have been assigned on Saturday, December 7 at a work party to sort books in the parish hall from 9 am to 4 pm, organized by Connie Kurz and Laura Snow. (We'll wrap gifts at church on December 15).

Used bicycles in any shape are also welcome. Take to Vélocity Bicycle Cooperative (velocitycoop.org/donate-stuff/), 2111 Mt Vernon Avenue, Tuesday – Saturdays from 10 am – 4 pm church any time. **Vélocity provides beautifully refurbished bikes for many of the children on our list (last year 70 bikes).**

Clean out your closets and attics to give a new life to good used items: used computers, cleaning out of all data provided), **new toys and children's books, calendars you receive in the mail, and gently used clothing and blankets** (for children and adults) — especially warm winter coats and adult work clothes to wear to a new-found job. You can include good used items unwrapped with your gifts or just bring them to church (label packages of clothing as to kind and size) to be displayed at our **boutique** at Human Services where social workers can pick them up for families they work with. Extra hangers are also needed.

The boutique still can use helpers. Setting up the Boutique involves unpacking and sorting all the used items contributed, laying them out on a table, and hanging up clothes sorted by gender and size.
