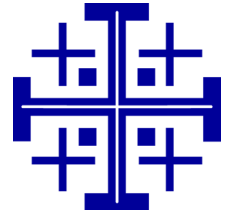

## The First Lesson: Acts 2:14a, 36-41

Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd, "Let the entire house of Israel know with certainty that God has made him both Lord and Messiah, this Jesus whom you crucified."

Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and to the other apostles, "Brothers, what should we do?" Peter said to them, "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you, for your children, and for all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to him." And he testified with many other arguments and exhorted them, saying, "Save yourselves from this corrupt generation." So those who welcomed his message were baptized, and that day about three thousand persons were added.

## **The Holy Gospel: Luke 24:13-35**

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to Luke

Response: *Glory be to thee, O Lord.*

Now on that same day two of Jesus' disciples were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem, and talking with each other about all these things that had happened. While they were talking and discussing, Jesus himself came near and went with them, but their eyes were kept from recognizing him. And he said to them, "What are you discussing with each other while you walk along?" They stood still, looking sad. Then one of them, whose name was Cleopas, answered him, "Are you the only stranger in Jerusalem who does not know the things that have taken place there in these days?" He asked them, "What things?" They replied, "The things about Jesus of Nazareth, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people, and how our chief priests and leaders handed him over to be condemned to death and crucified him. But we had hoped that he was the one to redeem Israel. Yes, and besides all this, it is now the third day since these things took place. Moreover, some women of our group astounded us. They were at the tomb early this morning, and when they did not find his body there, they came back and told us that they had indeed seen a vision of angels who said that he was alive. Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said; but they did not see him." Then he said to them, "Oh, how foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have declared! Was it not necessary that the Messiah should suffer these things and then enter into his glory?" Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them the things about himself in all the scriptures.

As they came near the village to which they were going, he walked ahead as if he were going on. But they urged him strongly, saying, "Stay with us, because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over." So he went in to stay with them. When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. They said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?" That same hour they got up and returned to Jerusalem; and they found the eleven and their companions gathered together. They were saying, "The Lord has risen indeed, and he has appeared to Simon!" Then they told what had happened on the road, and how he had been made known to them in the breaking of the bread.

## Lazarus Emergency Financial Ministry Spring2ACTion Early Giving is Open!

Alexandria's annual day of generosity is coming up on April 22, and this year [Christ Church Lazarus Emergency Financial Ministry](#) is hoping to raise \$120,000. Also known as **Lazarus West End**, this ministry helps Alexandria residents whose budgets don't have room for unexpected expenses and where just a few hundred dollars can be the difference between staying current on rent, keeping the lights on or paying a medical bill. Your generosity makes this ministry possible – in 2025, thanks to your help, Lazarus was open 44 weeks of the year, and we funded 611 requests for assistance with rent, utilities, medical bills, and other household expenses. Thanks to wonderful, generous people, Lazarus Emergency Financial Ministry directly carries out Jesus's most important commandment, **to love God with all our heart and to love our neighbors as ourselves**. In a typical week last month, Lazarus helped 18 people including:

- A man hospitalized for two weeks for a serious medical condition, missed three weeks of work, and fell behind on rent. Lazarus helped him with \$500 towards his balance—he avoided eviction.
- A Department of Homeland Security employee who was furloughed for two months, used up his savings, and couldn't pay his rent until the government shutdown ended. Lazarus provided \$500 towards his rent and secured another \$400 from a community partner.
- A woman whose husband lost months of income because the owner of the construction company he worked for was deported by ICE. They needed help with rent to avoid eviction. Lazarus contributed \$700 toward their rental balance.
- A Department of Defense analyst whose contract abruptly ended--he could not pay his April rent in full. Lazarus contributed \$400 towards his balance and referred him to another community partner for his remaining rental balance.
- A woman who babysat kids in her neighborhood to earn rent money, but now many of her parents aren't working due to fears of ICE arrest. She no longer earns enough to pay her rent; Lazarus helped with \$535 to pay her balance.

In one afternoon, Lazarus counselors met with these Alexandria residents and 13 others with similar stories. Of the Spanish speaking guests, 54% were impacted by immigration concerns or fear of ICE. With the help of community partners, Lazarus was able to prevent one eviction and keep two utilities from being disconnected. We advocated for one guest who was being treated unfairly by his landlord. In total, **Lazarus paid 18 bills and spent \$8,603.14** with nine bills paid in full.
