VESTRY UPDATES: NOTES FROM OUR SENIOR WARDEN

On September 14th, the Vestry met via Zoom, and used the first hour regathering ourselves, holding space, and giving time for each person to share their journey during these times. Fr. Randy closed this time with prayer for all that we had shared and for continued guidance from God for our personal lives and in our ministry through Vestry service.

In the second half of the meeting, we focused on the care and development of our church community. We received a financial report from Tom Hewson, our Treasurer, reviewing our cash flow and establishing a timeline for potential revisions to any of our budget areas through the end of the year. We are blessed to have strong financial support from our parishioners, and we remain in a strong financial state.

Vestry member Brooke Roberts created the recent all-parish survey and reviewed the responses she has received so far and tabulated. The survey was sent to all parishioners via email and regular mail in late August. The survey was created to help us continue to plan responsibly and be responsive to the needs of all our parishioners. Here are several highlights that are especially helpful to us as we plan for this fall and winter programs.

1. Online services continue to be appreciated and there's a strong response that we should continue to offer them even as more in-person activities resume. Online Bible studies, book studies, small groups, and committee meetings were also widely noted as being helpful, appreciated, and desired even when in-person activities resume regularly.

2. Outdoor worship was noted as very valuable, both during this period and as something to continue in the future.

3. Respondents noted that they are eager and, in many cases, willing to volunteer for activities again - especially serving during church services. And, with the Pumpkin Patch just around the corner, many responded that they are ready to volunteer outdoors again this year!

4. We heard from people who would like to participate online but are unable to, and from those who are not ready to be in-person for indoor services and activities but are missing the Immanuel community as we moved back to more indoor options. This information is especially valued and helpful as we think about the variety of church programs that we can offer.

5. In response to a survey question about mask wearing, we had a significant number of parishioners who will wear a mask and want others to wear masks for indoor activities, and the next highest response is from are those who will wear a mask if others want them to. This further reinforces that our community values taking care of each other and those around us. Our policy on mask wearing indoors, and in outdoor situations where distancing is not possible, will continue as long as it's needed and we encourage you to continue to be considerate of children who cannot be vaccinated, those who are immunocompromised or otherwise unable to get the vaccine. And of course, please stay home if you are at all under the weather.

We will continue to monitor this survey for additional responses, especially for those who may prefer to return a paper copy instead of submitting it online. It's not too late for your survey responses be included! Copies are available through the Parish Office.

Other updates:

- Darrell Wilson, Jr. Warden for Buildings and Grounds on the numerous projects to care for, maintain, and improve our physical spaces;
- Kristi Kubista-Hovis, Outreach Steward, on the plans for the Pumpkin Patch;
- Danette (Dani) Kauffman, Stewardship and Planned Giving Steward, on the plans for the upcoming Every Member Pledge campaign, which will begin in November;
- Harrison Clark, Vestry Steward for Children, Youth, and Families, and Fr. Sam Sheridan on the plans for youth formation for the remainder of the year; and
- Father Randy, Sam, and Susan on upcoming Bible studies, worship plans, and pastoral care to the community.
- We adjourned our meeting with a prayer offered by Father Sam, lifting up to God the needs expressed and those in our hearts.

I personally left feeling particularly blessed to have the opportunity to serve as a member of this Vestry and with a much-appreciated sense of our collective commitment to our community's continued well-being.

The vestry meets on the second Tuesday of the month from 7-9 p.m., all months except for one month in summer.
