LENTEN FORUM HOUR SERIES CONTINUES: LIVE NEXT SUNDAY

Let's enjoy a new take on the traditional Lenten subject of fasting, and examine it in several forms. We hope you will set aside some time at 11:45 a.m. on Sundays after Eucharist, to reflect on all the different things it means to fast or go without.

February 28th - FASTING AT IMMANUEL: Led by the Rector, we'll examine times in this community where we've experienced personal and corporate fasting, and how members of our church family have discovered something meaningful by intentionally disrupting their own everyday patterns.

March 14th - SANCTIFICATION: A conversation explicitly about the effects of removing or pausing something harmful or negative from your life. What would it mean to turn away from items and practices that you believe cause you harm, and turn towards only those things that contribute to your sanctification, to your holiness, to furthering your relationship with the Love at the center of all being?

March 21st - ABUNDANCE, NEW LIFE, AND WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE? A meditation and conversation about how we have been living this forced fast of social distancing, masks, and gathering restrictions. What will it look like to regather? What will it feel like to return to something more like



COOK WITH IMMANUEL'S CARPENTER'S SHELTER TEAM

Do you like to cook? Do you worry about people suffering homelessness in Alexandria? If so, our Carpenter's Shelter team invites you to join us at the beautiful new Shelter facility at 930 North Henry Street in Old Town.

We cook and deliver a healthy dinner for Shelter residents and staff on the **second Thursday** of every month. You can help in any of three ways, depending on your schedule:

- 1. You can buy and prepare ingredients for a side dish, such as slicing cucumbers and peppers for a salad;
- 2. You can cook a side dish or dessert, serving about 12 people, from recipes and instructions we provide; and/or
- 3. You can reheat and serve the prepared meal in the Shelter's kitchen, from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. This is a great ministry for a couple of family members or friends (age 18 and over).

Volunteers receive assignments, recipes, aluminum pans, and some bulk ingredients each month. You can prep and cook the food at home, and then deliver it to organizers Connie Kurz and Laura Snow, who live a block from the church. Memorial Service for Dick and Judy Bednar


