



JOSHUA IN 3D: A Social Justice-Oriented Bible Book Study

Join us this Wednesday at 7p.m. online via Zoom for a bible study of Chapters 20 and 21 of Joshua. What do we do with people in our midst who we don't think of as one of us? Contrasting images of Retaliation, Refuge, and Mediation permeate this text and our own history with it. This will be a particularly weird conversation to have in our Social Justice context because it immediately brings to mind the modern discussion of "Sanctuary Cities" which Hawk just didn't reference when he wrote his book. We won't really be talking about this very in-the-news use of this concept. We'll pull back, travel backwards in time, and imagine with Daniel Hawk the differences between how British and French colonists each interacted with the native population.

We're discussing the book of Joshua and a variety of ways— including using L. Daniel Hawk's book "Joshua in 3D: A Commentary on Biblical Conquest and Manifest Destiny" — that biblical themes can help us parse through American history and values. We'll look at Chapters 20/21 of Joshua, and chapter 10 of Hawk's book Joshua in 3D. (Excerpts from the book can be found here for anyone interested)


