Christmas Families in August CAMPAIGN FOR LEARNING UPDATE

Many thanks to the parishioners who signed up to provide backpacks filled with school supplies for 32 children. **There are still 38 children who need a sponsor**. We hope there will be more sign-ups for families with several children, including the family with four 6-year-olds. <u>Perhaps two parish families could team up to provide for one of these larger families</u>.

Urgent. <u>Six children go to Tucker Elementary School, which starts on July 26.</u> <u>Supplies for these children are needed by Sunday, July 9 (or July 16 in a pinch),</u> but none are "adopted" yet. If necessary, we can divide these Families

Sign-up will continue at both services through the end of July. During the week the sign-up boards will be will be in the Zabriskie narthex.

Learning lays the foundation for success. Let us launch children a successful and productive life.



There are two ways you can help:

(1) Sign up to provide a backpack filled with school supplies for the children in one family identified by DHS after each service between now and Sunday, July 23. The sign-up boards are in the narthex of Zabriskie Chapel during the week. We will give you a yellow instruction sheet with the children's names and all the information you need. Feel free to email <u>ds@dsoergel.com</u> or <u>serabian@somaarchitects.com</u> for help in selecting a family.

Bring the backpacks to church (or the office) on or before Sunday, August 6 to be blessed at the altar. Unassigned school supplies, especially backpacks (new or lightly used) are also welcome.

(2) Donate money through the special collection held on Sunday, August 6. Please make checks out to Immanuel and mark them "XFAM". The money will go to the Haiti <u>Micah project</u> (50%, last year \$2,000) and to Community Lodgings and Human Services in Alexandria. (25%, last year \$1,000, each). If the special collections exceed \$4,000, we could support Offender Aid and Restoration to help with school supplies for children with an incarcerated parent.

The **Haiti Micah Project (HMP)** is one of Immanuel's major international outreach ministries; it serves impoverished children in Mirebalais, Haiti. For these children, education offers the only path out of extreme poverty. In Haiti, there is no free public education. Therefore, HMP provides educational stipends (currently for 152 children, including 22 in its orphanage) including tuition, school supplies, and uniforms. With the support of churches like Immanuel, these children have the opportunity to become contributing members of their society.

Our former rector, the late Rev. Bill Dols said "Christmas Families is a ministry of things". It is that, but it is so much more. It provides things that empower and lift the spirit, tools for learning that **send children off to a good start in the new school year.**
